The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Wednesday March 14, 2018 in the Council Chamber of Town Hall at 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Merritt Mill East, Multi-Family Residential Development Special Use Permit and Rezoning Applications (Project #17-084)

The Town has received an application for construction of 27,500 sq. ft. of floor area for 24, 1-bedroom affordable dwelling units on a 2-parcel assemblage for a 1.2 acre site. The current zoning is Residential-3 (R-3) and is proposed to be rezoned to Residential-Special Standards-Conditional (R-SS-C). The adjacent parcel to the west is within the Town of Carrboro and is proposed to be a part of the CASA project known as Merritt Mill West. This parcel is being reviewed by Town of Carrboro. Land Use Management Ordinance Text Amendment – Conditioned Self Storage

The Town Council will consider a proposed text amendment to the Land Use Management Ordinance to create new regulations for "Self-storage facility, conditioned" including permitting "Self-storage facility, conditioned" as a Special Use in the Office/Institutional–2 (OI-2) District.

Last Call for Leaf Collection!

Chapel Hill's final collection of loose leaves for this season will begin on Monday, March 5. Place loose leaves at the curb for collection.

Anyone having leaves after leaf collection has ended should put them in a yard debris cart or other rigid container for curbside collection with yard waste. Leaves may also be placed in 30 gallon, 50-pound weight limit brown paper bags. Leaves in plastic bags will not be collected.
