The Town of Chapel Hill is hiring a new Town Manager. Residents are invited to apply to participate as assessors in the Town Manager Assessment Center. Apply by noon Monday, April 16, 2018.

Assessors will observe candidates for the Town Manager position in simulated scenarios and report back to a candidate review committee. Selected assessors must attend both days of the Assessment Center on May 31 and June 1. Training is provided.
