Apply for Funds to Create Affordable Housing Opportunities

The Town of Chapel Hill is accepting applications through Friday, August 31, to create affordable housing opportunities in the community.

Awards will be made from the Town's Affordable Housing Development Reserve (AHDR), established by the Town Council in March 2015. The total funds currently available in the reserve are ~\$750,000.

The Town of Chapel Hill will accept applications for the following priority project areas:

1. land bank and land acquisition
2. rental subsidy and development
3. homeownership development and assistance
4. future development planning

The Town's fiscal year 2018 budget includes approximately \$688,000 million in funding available in the Affordable Housing Development Reserve.

The Housing Advisory Board will evaluate applications and present a funding recommendation to the Town Council for final approval in September 2018. There may be up to two additional funding cycles this fiscal year (July 1, 2018–June 30, 2019).

Chapel Hill's New Town Manager

The Chapel Hill Town Council announced the appointment of Maurice Jones as the new town manager on Tuesday, July 10. Jones will begin working for the Town of Chapel Hill on Aug. 20.

Jones has served as city manager of Charlottesville, Va., since December 2010. Originally from Dale City, Va., Jones graduated from James Madison University with a bachelor's degree in communications. He also holds a Master of Business Administration degree from the Darden School Business at the University of Virginia.

The Council conducted an extensive nationwide search for the position, gathering initial public input at listening sessions, and via social media and surveys. Chapel Hill residents were also selected for participation in an assessment center that engaged candidates in simulated scenarios.

During the management transition, Jones will work closely with Roger Stancil who announced his retirement last fall after 12 years as Chapel Hill's town manager. Stancil will continue service for the Town of Chapel Hill through August.

Fire Station 2 Dedication

Chapel Hill's newest fire station at 1003 Hamilton Road will be dedicated at 11 a.m. Saturday, July 14. The dedication ceremony will be followed by an open house.

Fire personnel will be on hand to answer questions from the community and give a tour of the station. Elected officials, Town staff and retirees will perform an uncoupling of a fire hose to symbolize a ribbon cutting at the conclusion of the 30-minute program.

Parking will be available in the deck next to Fire Station 2 on Hamilton Road. Additional parking will be available on Prestwick Road.

Fire Station 2, which was put into service on May 24, 2018, replaced a nearly 60-year old building that previously sat on the same property. The station houses Chapel Hill Engine 32, an Orange County EMS ambulance and the new Truck 72, a \$1.3 million bond-fund ladder company.
