Public Hearing on Proposed Glen Lennox Area Neighborhood Conservation District for Glen Lennox Apartment and Commercial Property

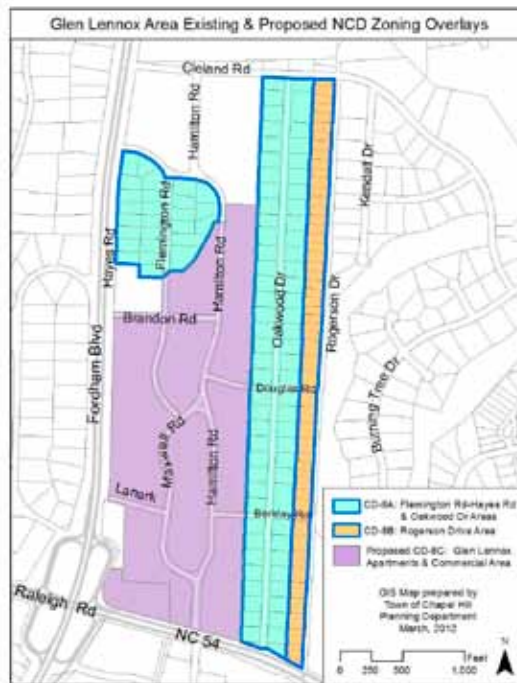
On April 23, 2012, the Chapel Hill Town Council will hold a public hearing to receive feedback about the proposed Zoning Atlas Amendment to create a Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD) zoning overlay for the Glen Lennox apartment and commercial property. (See map below)

The proposed NCD zoning overlay regulations are outlined in the draft Glen Lennox Area Neighborhood Conservation District Plan for CD-8C, and can be found online at www.townofchapelhill.com/glenlennox.

Information on protest petitions is available from the Planning Department or the Town Clerk. Protest petitions must be filed with the Town Clerk by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, April 18, 2012.

On May 30, 2012, the Town Council will consider possible enactment of the draft Glen Lennox Area Neighborhood Conservation District Plan for the Glen Lennox apartment and commercial property (CD-8C).
