Council Adopts New Budget

The budget that
has been adopted
by the Chapel Hill
Town Council for the
2012–13 fiscal year
will require no tax

increases for the fourth consecutive year. Some fees for
Town services have increased.

The fine for overdue materials at Chapel Hill Public
Library has increased from 20 to 25 cents per day for
all materials except DVDs. The overdue fine for DVDs
has changed from 50 cents to \$1 per day.

Monthly parking space rental has increased from \$85
to \$95 at the Wallace Deck, 127 W. Rosemary Lot
and the West Franklin-Basnight Lot. Residential Park-
ing permits are now free for those 65 and older.

Other fees that have increased include annual gymna-
sium passes, climbing wall passes, swimming passes
and fees for pool and meeting room rental. Information:
