Check out this helpful information as you move into the neighborhood:

Living Logistics—No More than 4 Unrelated People!



No more than **four unrelated people** can reside in a dwelling unit (for example, in a single family house or on one side of a duplex). Violators could be fined up to \$100 per day for the first offense, \$200 per day for the second offense within 180 days, and \$500 per day for a third offense within 365 days. Having more than six unrelated persons in a dwelling unit is a violation of the NC Fire Code and could result in a civil penalty in the amount of \$500 per violation for everyday the violation continues.

Parking Possibilities



A **maximum of four cars** are allowed on a lot (includes parking in the side and back yard); this regulation only applies to the Northside and Pine Knolls neighborhoods.

Parking is only permitted in designated areas on a property (not on front-yards/grass). Violators could receive an immediate \$100 fine and could be fined \$100 per day if the violation is not addressed. Have questions? Contact the Chapel Hill Planning Department at 919-968-2728.

Trash Talk and Recycling Reminders



Trash cans and recycle bins must be placed at the curb by 6am on collection day and **brought in by 7pm on the same day**. Be sure to check with your landlord about what day is your trash and recycling day (and remember, recycling is now single stream!). Violators could be fined \$25 per day. Noise Nuisances



Loud parties may be cited for violating the noise ordinance. Also, be sure not to operate your vehicle sound system so that it could be heard more than 30 feet away. Violators will be cited. If you are having a party, contact the Chapel Hill Police Department at 919-968-2846.
