The Muslim Journeys Bookshelf—a collection of books, films and other resources featuring Muslim culture in the United States and around the world—is now available at the Chapel Hill Public Library.

The Chapel Hill Public Library, in partnership with the UNC-Chapel Hill School of Information and Library

Science, is one of 12 public libraries in North Carolina to receive this collection. SILS is also involved with helping the library schedule speakers and presenters for upcoming programs in the fall.

Developed by the National Endowment for the Humanities and the American Library Association (ALA) based on the advice of scholars, librarians, and other public programming experts, the Muslim Journeys Bookshelf is intended to address both the need and desire of the American public for trustworthy and accessible resources about Muslim beliefs and practices and the cultural heritage associated with Islamic civilizations.
