Anyone having leaves after leaf collection has ended should put them in a yard debris cart or other rigid container for curbside collection with yard waste. Leaves may also be placed in 30 gallon, 50-pound weight limit brown paper bags. Leaves in plastic bags will not be collected. All comments received will be recorded and submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The official review period is from February 12, 2013 through March 29, 2013.
