The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, Feb. 18, in the Council Chamber of Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Land Use Management Ordinance Text Amendment.

The Town Council will consider a text amendment to the Land Use Management Ordinance regarding proposed changes to Section 5.14 Signs.

Public Hearing: Draft Greenways Master Plan

A public hearing has been called to consider adoption of a new Greenways Master Plan to replace the current plan that was adopted in 2006. The Plan identifies potential trail development, changes in previously identified trail alignments, opportunities for local and regional connectivity, and constraints to connectivity within the Town's greenways system.

Public Hearing: Draft Comprehensive Parks Plan

A public hearing has been called to consider adoption of a new Comprehensive Parks Plan to replace the current plan that was adopted in 2002. The Plan details potential capital level renovations, improvements, land acquisition, and new park development that could take place over the next ten years; if financial resources were available.

Chapel Hill Transit employees to perform the Rosa Parks story

Chapel Hill Transit (CHT) employees will present the one-act play "Why Should I Move?" at **11 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 23**, on the stage near Dillard's at University Mall.

The free performance is being held in conjunction with Black History Month, an annual celebration of achievements by black Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of African Americans in U.S. history. Rosa Parks was a central figure in Black History as her courageous act of refusing to give up her seat on a Montgomery Ala., bus helped spark the Civil Rights movement.

The play is a reenactment of the day Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a Montgomery, Ala., bus. In addition to the play, an a cappella vocal group of CHT employees will use song to interpret the mood of the events.

Public Forum on Town Budget

The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at

Feb. 27, in the Council Chamber of Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider an agenda that includes the following:

- Town services and projects for the budget for July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2014;
- Capital improvement needs for 2013-2028;
- How to use the 2013-2014 Community Development grant to address housing and other community needs of lower income households and areas;
- How to use the 2013-2014 federal Housing Capital Fund grant for improvements, renovations and related items in public housing neighborhoods;
- How to use the 2013-2014 federal HOME grant in Orange County to address housing needs of lower income households;
- How to use the 2013-2014 federal and state transit grants for capital projects, operating costs and transportation planning;
- The Downtown Service District boundary and services in the year beginning on July 1, 2013; and
- Potential legislative requests to the 2013 session of the North Carolina General Assembly.

The forum on Feb. 27 is an initial step in the Mayor and Council's process for developing the 2013-2014 budget and related items listed above.

April 10: Second public forum for preliminary 15-year capital program; 2013-14 budget development, consideration of Community Development, HOME and Public Housing Capital Grants
