The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, March 18, in the Council Chamber at Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Revised Concept Plan Review: The Park @ Chapel Hill, Mixed-Use Development

A concept plan has been submitted to the Town by Bluerock Real Estate to redevelop an apartment complex at 1250 Ephesus Church Road, known as Colony Apartments. The submitted plan proposes an assemblage of 7 parcels located in the Residential-2 and Residential-5 zoning districts totaling 15.8 acres and includes the following:

- Demolition of 15 apartment buildings with 198 dwelling units;
- Dedication of right-of-way for extension of S. Elliott Road to Ephesus Church Road;
- Construction of a gas station/convenience store; and
- Construction of 775 dwelling units in four townhome buildings and three 5 and 7-story apartment buildings.

Portions of the proposed site contain 100-year floodplain, Resource Conservation District, and a Jordan Buffer and is identified as Orange County Parcel Identification Numbers 9799-33-3628, 9799-34-0136, 9799-34-0248, 9799-34-0349, 9799-34-0467, 9799-34-0588, and 9799-34-6446).
