Library @ U Mall to Close March 16

The Chapel Hill Public Library is getting ready to close in preparation for the move into the newly expanded library facility in Pritchard Park. The library will close on March 16 and will remain closed for about three weeks, reopening at 100 Library Drive in early April.

Patrons will be unable to return books or other materials while the library is closed, so due dates will be adjusted so no materials will be due during this time and no fines will accrue. Chapel Hill Public Library materials cannot be returned to other libraries, so please hold on to all materials until the library reopens.

During the first half of March, crews will install new furniture and library shelves. A wide array of technology will be installed throughout the library, and all systems will be tested. Once the furniture, shelving and technology are in place, the library will close its doors in the University Mall to pack up collections and computers and move them over.
