PARK ON THE HILL rolls out parking info for Chapel Hill

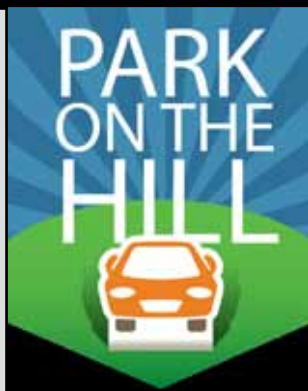
Parking keeps getting better in downtown Chapel Hill.

Over the past 18 months, the Town of Chapel Hill has added three new public parking lots, pay stations that accept credit cards, and bright blue signage at all the lots. Now there's a new website at www.parkonthehill.com that shows all downtown parking – public, private, valet, and UNC lots.

Quick Facts about Chapel Hill Parking

- Parking is free after 6 p.m. at all on-street meters and after 8 p.m. at off-street lots
- Parking downtown is always free on Sundays
- Chapel Hill has issued about 5,000 "courtesy" tickets to first-time violators of expired meters. "Hey, we don't like to give tickets!"
- Prefer valet? 15 business participate in FREE valet parking.
- Meters cost 50 cents to \$1.25 per hour, and attended lots charge \$1 to \$1.30 per hour.
- The newest public parking lot is located at 140 West Franklin.

Concept Plan Review: Calvander-Eubanks Duke Energy Substation, 1615 Eubanks Road

A concept plan has been submitted to the Town by Scott Murray Land Planning, Inc. to construct a Duke Energy power substation. The 13.24-acre site is located at 1615 Eubanks Road adjacent to the Orange County Animal Hospital on the north. Genestu Drive and a railroad line bisect the property. The property is in the Residential-1 zoning district and is outside the Town limits (Orange County Parcel Identification Numbers 9870-77-6296 and 9870-76-4978).
