The Town of Chapel Hill's Fourth of July Fireworks Celebration will be held at Kenan Stadium starting Thursday, July 4. Gates open at 7 p.m. with family entertainment, including a juggling Uncle Sam, face painting and inflatable sports challenges, followed by a watermelon eating contest. Kenny Mann and the Liquid Pleasure Band will provide musical entertainment at 8 p.m. and the fireworks show will begin at 9:30 p.m.

Towing

The Town of Chapel Hill has taken action to address concerns from residents and visitors about potential predatory towing practices in Chapel Hill. The revised tow ordinance, which took effect Monday, June 24, regulates any non-consensual tow from commercial non-residential property.

A few of the key changes that were enacted by the Town Council are that tow fees are regulated and capped by the Town; tow lots may not be located farther than 15 miles outside of town, and tow zones must be marked with required signage.
