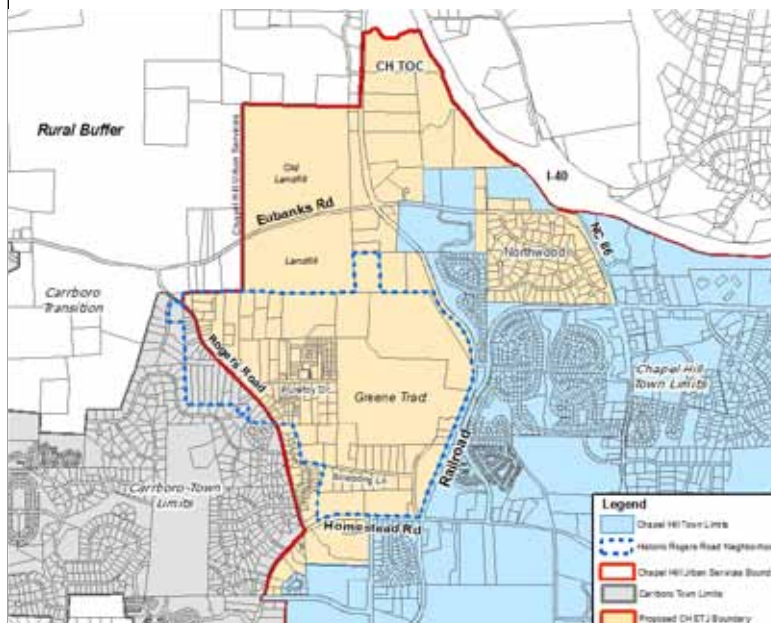

The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, Oct. 21, in the Southern Human Services Center Complex, 2051 Homestead Road, Chapel Hill, to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Expansion of the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) Boundary

A public hearing will be held to consider expanding the Town's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Boundary northwest of the Town's corporate limits. ETJ is area outside of the Town's limits that is subject to the Town's land development regulations. The properties within the proposed ETJ expansion area are currently within the Joint Planning Area (an agreement between Orange County, Carrboro, and Chapel Hill). These properties are currently subject to compliance with the Town's Land Use Management Ordinance. Building code and permitting will continue to be administered by the Town of Chapel Hill. Changes to zoning in areas under the Joint Planning Area are currently subject to review and approval by both Orange County and the Town of Chapel Hill. If the ETJ boundary is extended, the approval of rezoning would be subject to approval only by the Town Council. Please see www.townofchapelhill.org/index.aspx?page=2291 for more information.
