The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, Oct. 21, in the Southern Human Services Center Complex, 2051 Homestead Road, Chapel Hill, to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Timber Hollow Apartments, Rezoning and Special Use Request

A Zoning Atlas Amendment and Special Use Permit applications have been submitted by Blue Heron Asset Management which proposes to rezone a 19.5-acre site from Residential-4 (R-4) to Residential-5-C (R-5-C) and expand the multi-family development to include 109 new dwelling units in a 4-story building and in 4 quadplexes with 84 additional parking spaces. The site is located at 101 Timber Hollow Court between Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., Piney Mountain Road, and Mendel Drive and is identified as Orange County PIN 9789-37-6215 (Project No. 13-032).

Leaf Collection Begins Monday

The Town will begin leaf collection on Monday, Oct. 21. Place loose leaves and pine straw that are free of limbs and debris behind the curb or drainage ditch. Do not block roadways, bike lanes, sidewalks, fire hydrants, water meters, mail boxes, storm drains, gutter, ditches and utility boxes, or interfere with sight distances at intersections.
