Leaf Collection Has Begun

The Town's annual loose leaf collection has begun. Place loose leaves and pine straw that are free of limbs and debris behind the curb or drainage ditch. Leaf piles should not block roadways, bike lanes, sidewalks, fire hydrants, water meters, mail boxes, storm drains, gutters, ditches, and utility boxes, or interfere with sight distances at intersections.

Another option is to place leaves in 30-gallon brown paper yard waste bags or yard waste roll carts or other rigid containers for curbside collection.

Thursday Halloween on Franklin Street

The Town of Chapel Hill observes Halloween on Oct. 31. This year, Halloween falls on Thursday. Franklin Street will close at 9 p.m. and be reopened at 11:30 p.m.

The following restrictions are in place:

- Restricted access to downtown through lane and street closures
- No special event park and ride bus shuttles
- Parking will be essentially unavailable downtown
- Chapel Hill Transit will run its usual bus routes although some will be rerouted. Service on D, J, NS, NU and EZ Rider routes will end early. Safe Ride buses will be available.
- Downtown bars and restaurants will close to new patrons at 1 a.m. and will charge a minimum \$5 cover charge to patrons not attending private events. Downtown convenience stores that sell alcohol will close or stop selling alcohol at 1 a.m.

Homegrown Halloween: What Residents Need to Know

If you work or live within Chapel Hill, please check traffic announcements and make plans on Halloween (Thursday, Oct. 31) to avoid traffic congestion. If you are a Chapel Hill Transit rider, check bus schedules for changes on this day.

Beginning at about 9 p.m., many streets will be closed or have lane reductions. The Town of Chapel Hill will make every effort to keep people who are attending the event from parking in nearby neighborhoods. Access to neighborhoods will be limited starting early in the evening. Residents of the neighborhood and their guests will be able to drive in and out of the enclosed area.

Yard waste collection will be conducted as usual on Thursday, Oct. 31. Friday yard waste collection will be postponed to Friday, Nov. 8.
