#### Concept Plan Review – Franklin Student Housing 106 Mallette Street (Project Number 13-067)

A Concept Plan has been submitted to the Town by the John R. McAdams Company to construct student apartments at 106 Mallette St. (between Kenan and Mallette streets). The proposed .7-acre site is an existing public and private parking lot. The property is located in the Town Center-2 zoning district and Downtown Study Area The application includes the following: 103,726 square foot 6-story building including 55 dwelling units and a multi-level under-building parking structure with 121 parking spaces.
