Public Meeting on Flood Insurance

A public information meeting on the new Orange County Flood Insurance Study will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 18, in meeting room A of the Chapel Hill Public Library, 100 Library Drive.

Residents and businesses are invited to attend. The data will be presented on computers layered over the County's parcel data beginning at 4 p.m., followed by a brief presentation at 5 p.m. The public may drop in to review the data and ask questions anytime between 5:30 and 7 p.m. Staff members from Orange County and the towns of Chapel Hill, Carrboro and Hillsborough will be available to help residents locate properties on the maps and determine their level of flood risk.
