Town of Chapel Hill, North Carolina – Notice of Public Hearing Acquisition of American Legion Property with Seller's Financing

The Town Council of the Town of Chapel Hill, North Carolina, will hold a public hearing on Monday, March 6, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. (or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard). The purpose of the hearing is to take public comment in accordance with North Carolina General Statute Sec. 160A-20(g) concerning a proposed contract, under which the Town will pay a portion of the purchase price to the seller over time with interest, to purchase a parcel of approximately 35 acres off Legion Road in Chapel Hill commonly known as the "American Legion Property."

The stated purchase price for the property is \$7.9 million. There would be no recourse against the Town or its property (other than the American Legion Property itself) if the Town were to default under the contract.

The hearing will be held in the Town Council chambers at Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard, Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

All interested persons will be heard. The Town's plans are subject to change based on the comments received at the public hearing and the Town Council's subsequent discussion and consideration.
