Concept Plan: Wood Townhomes, Multi-Family Development 2217 Homestead Road (Project #16-122)

The Town has received a concept plan application from Gurlitz Architecture to develop a 15.73-acre site with 102 multi-family units, including approximately 208,598 sq. ft. of floor area. The site is located on the south side of Homestead Road, adjacent to Carolina North on the south and east and adjacent to the Courtyards of Homestead on the west.
