The Chapel Hill Board of Adjustment will hold a rescheduled meeting at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 22, 2017, in Chapel Hill Town Hall Council Chamber at 405 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. to consider the following:

2518 Millwood Court: Variance requests from the Jordan Lake Riparian Buffer, the Resource Conservation District and dimensional regulations of the Chapel Hill Land Use Management Ordinance for the purpose of the proposed conversion and expansion of a duplex into a single-family home with accessory unit.

Public Comment

Residents are invited to review and comment on the draft FY 2017–2018 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) Program Plans, and the draft 2017 Annual Update to the 2015–2019 Consolidated Plan. These plans detail the CDBG and HOME activities to be carried out in FY 2017–2018. The plans also document how the proposed activities will address the Town and County's affordable housing and community development priorities and objectives. All comments received will be incorporated into the final document that will be submitted to the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) by May 15, 2017.

The official comment period for the Annual Action Plan is April 14, 2017 through May 14, 2017.
