Amity Station Mixed-Use Development–322 W. Rosemary St. Concept Plan (Project # 15-015)

A concept plan application has been submitted by MHAWorks PA which proposes: Construction of a 243,693 s.f. 7 to 8-story mixed-use development with: 5,400 s.f. of retail and office space; 8,800 s.f. of flex space; and 204 residential units including 35 affordable housing units. Ground level and subsurface parking is proposed for 350–375 vehicles. The 2.2 acre site is located in the Town Center-2 (TC-2) and Residential-3 (R-3) zoning districts, within the Northside Neighborhood Conservation District, PINs 9788-17-8220; 9788-17-8053; 9788-17-9085. The Council will provide comments to the applicant, but will not grant an approval for this development concept.
