The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, May 15, in the Council Chamber of Chapel Hill Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider an agenda that includes the following:

#### Public Hearing on Town Budget

The Council invites residents to express their views on:

- Town services and projects for the budget for July 1, 2017, through June, 30, 2018;
- Capital Improvement needs for 2018–2033;
- How to use the 2017–2018 federal and state transit grants for capital projects, operating costs and transportation planning;
- The Downtown Service District services in the year beginning on July 1, 2017.

#### Amity Station Mixed-Use Development–322 W. Rosemary St. Concept Plan (Project # 15-015)

A concept plan application has been submitted by MHAWorks PA which proposes: Construction of a 243,693 s.f. 7 to 8-story mixed-use development with: 5,400 s.f. of retail and office space; 8,800 s.f. of flex space; and 204 residential units including 35 affordable housing units. Ground level and subsurface parking is proposed for 350–375 vehicles. The 2.2 acre site is located in the Town Center-2 (TC-2) and Residential-3 (R-3) zoning districts, within the Northside Neighborhood Conservation District, PINs 9788-17-8220; 9788-17-8053; 9788-17-9085. The Council will provide comments to the applicant, but will not grant an approval for this development concept. Chapel Hill Transit will make service schedule adjustments starting May 13. Weekend U and NU routes will not operate and will resume on Saturday, Aug. 12. Weekday U will not operate and will resume on Monday, Aug. 14. Weekday A-Limited morning trips (7:14–9:44 a.m.) will not operate and will resume on Monday, Aug. 14.

EZ Rider will operate Monday–Friday from 5 a.m. to 11:17 p.m., Saturdays from 8:15 a.m. to 6:52 p.m. and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. (Sunday service will operate within the town limits of Chapel Hill and Carrboro on a space available basis. Reservations for Sunday service must be requested no later than 12 p.m. on the Friday prior to the requested Sunday service date). Reservations will be available from 1 to 5 p.m. on weekends.

Safe Ride routes will end on Saturday, April 29 and will resume on Thursday, Aug. 24.
