Concept Plan Review – North Estes Mixed-Use Center

A concept plan has been submitted to the Town by Scott Murray Land Planning, Inc./Caliber Partners. The plan includes a 327,380 square foot development, which includes 215 dwelling units, office and retail space, and a 3-level parking deck. The site is located at 850 North Estes Drive, on the northeast corner of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. and North Estes Drive. The 14.7-acre site is identified as Orange County Parcel Identifier Number 9789-35-9617 and is zoned Residential-1 (R-1). Land Use Management Ordinance Text Amendment – Design Manual
