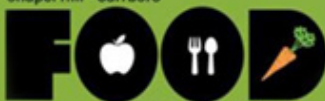

Food for the Summer

Chapel Hill–Carrboro’s Food For the Summer is up and running again this summer! Food for the Summer meal sites will be open from Monday, June 12, to Friday, August 25.

Last summer, the Food for the Summer Partnership worked to close the summer meal gap by providing weekday lunch for children at 16 walkable meal sites throughout our community. With the help of a network of more than 650 volunteers, about 48,000 meals and more than 3,500 free books were distributed to local children.

Food for the Summer aims to do more this summer. Organizers are reaching out to members of the community to volunteer their time to help distribute meals and help supervise lunchtime play at walkable sites throughout Chapel Hill.

Groundbreaking Ceremony for Historic Rogers Road Sewer System

A groundbreaking ceremony for a new sanitary sewer system to serve the Historic Rogers Road area will take place at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 20, at the RENA Community Center, 101 Edgar St. A collaborative effort among Orange County and the towns of Chapel Hill and Carrboro has worked to extend sewer service and establish a community center in the Historic Rogers Road–Eubanks Road Community. Construction of the sewer system will begin in July and may last up to 12 months.
