The Town of Chapel Hill offers indoor and outdoor pools so you can stay cool in the summer heat.

Three aquatics facilities managed by the Town include the A.D. Clark Outdoor Pool at Hargraves Center, 216 N. Roberson St.; two indoor pools at the Homestead Aquatics Center, 300 Aquatic Drive—a warm water pool and a lap pool; and an indoor pool at the Chapel Hill Community Center. All facilities have locker rooms, showers and family changing rooms.
