Board of Adjustment Notice

The Chapel Hill Board of Adjustment will hold a meeting at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, August 2, 2017 in the Council Chamber of Chapel Hill Town Hall at 405 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. to consider the following application:

514 E. Rosemary Street: Appeal of a Historic District Commission decision to deny an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness, for a new single-family home, at the June 13, 2017 HDC Meeting (Project #17-072) and appeal of determination by Town staff that applicant is not entitled to Certificate of Appropriateness for this same house as a result of HDC's failure to take action on application within 180 days of submittal.
