#### September 13

The Chapel Hill Town Council will hold a public hearing at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 13, 2017 in the Council Chamber of Chapel Hill Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., Chapel Hill, NC, to consider an amendment to the Town's Code Section 3-7 (which currently allows the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays from 10 a.m. to noon for on-premises consumption) to also allow the sale by licensees with off-premises permits issued under N.C. General Statute Section 18B-1001.

The Council intends to consider enactment of this ordinance to implement authorization granted by N.C. General Statute Section 160A-205.3, as enacted by Session Law 2017- 87, Section 4.(c).
