The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 13, 2017 in Town Hall at 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Notice of Public Hearing: Proposed Amendment to Ordinance to Allow Sale of Alcoholic Beverages on Sundays Beginning at 10 a.m.

The Council will hold a public hearing to consider an amendment to the Town's Code Section 3-7 (which currently allows the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays from 10 a.m. to noon for on-premises consumption) to also allow the sale by licensees with off-premises permits issued under N.C. General Statute Section 18B-1001.

The Council intends to consider enactment of this ordinance to implement authorization granted by N.C. General Statute Section 160A-205.3, as enacted by Session Law 2017- 87, Section 4.(c).

Public Comment on CDBG Plan Amendments and Use of 2018-2019 CDBG Funds

Amendments to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and the 2017-2018 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Annual Update to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan are being considered. The draft amendments reflect allocation of program income received and reallocation of funds, with changes to the approved program plan activities.
