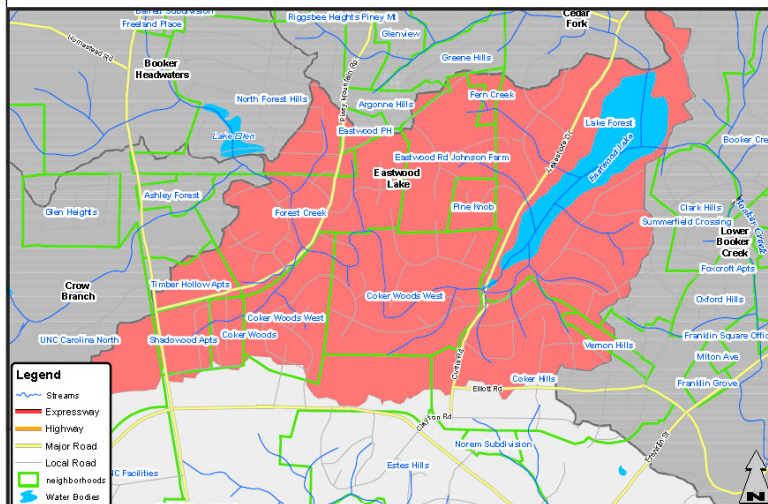

Review of Concept Plan for Chapel Hill Cooperative Preschool – Parking Lot Expansion (Project 17-086). This application proposes construction of 14 additional parking spaces at a previously approved 9,000 square foot preschool facility. Concept plan Reviews are an early opportunity for community members and the Community Design Commission to provide feedback on a proposed project before the applicant submits a special use permit application with a traffic analysis, and before staff review occurs.
