In response to feedback to public residents, the Town of Chapel Hill Housing & Community Department will be removing the names of some people from the Public Housing Trespass List effective Nov. 1, 2017. The Trespass List is a list of persons who have been trespassed from public housing properties.

We are trying to re-think how we handle trespass issues in our neighborhoods and establishing time limitations for specific actions.
