Help keep the wreath green this holiday season by preventing household fires. A wreath on Fire Station No. 1 at 403 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. starts the holiday season filled with green bulbs. For each residential structure fire in Chapel Hill, a green bulb will be replaced with a red bulb.

To help keep the wreath green, choose holiday decorations that are made of flame-resistant, flame-retardant or non-combustible materials. Never leave candles unattended. Inspect holiday lights before using and discard any with defects. Turn off holiday lights when you are away from home. Make sure there is a working smoke alarm on each level of your home.
