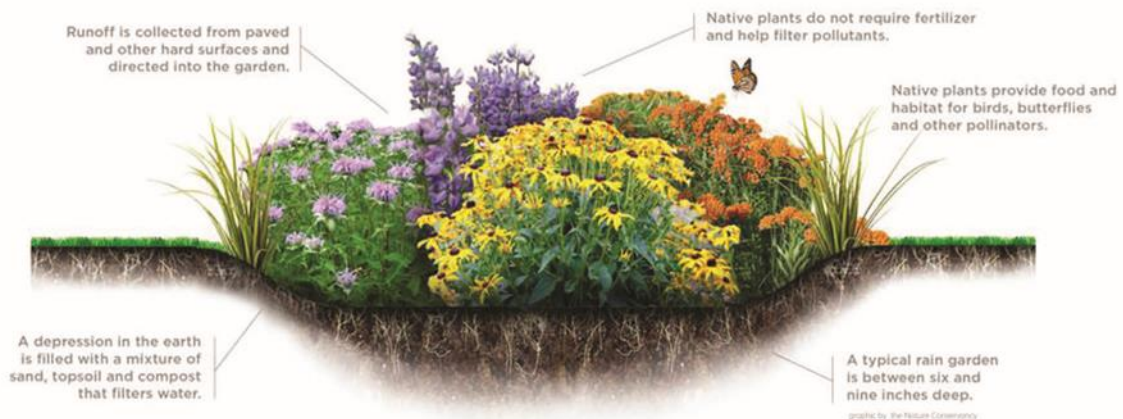

**Rain Gardens.** They can help to filter stormwater pollutants, temporarily contain runoff from heavy rains to reduce flooding, provide habitat and food for pollinators and birds, and capture drainage to recharge groundwater.

Join Mitch Woodward from the NC Cooperative Extension Service to learn how simple rain gardens can be both functional and beautiful. You will learn how to locate, size, build, plant and maintain rain gardens. Part of the workshop will be spent outside with hands-on learning. Please dress appropriately and bring gardening gloves if you wish.
