## Greenway Tunnel Construction

Construction on the tunnel for the Bolin Creek Greenway that will pass under Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard is expected to begin in late April or early May.

Most of the tunnel work is completed. Work was delayed due to concerns over an old coal ash disposal site in the area. The project will proceed with steps being taken such as retaining soil that is dug up during the construction for further testing, and proper disposal if needed. Bolin Creek Trail, one of the most challenging sections of the Chapel Hill greenways system, includes an underpass of Pritchard Avenue, two bridges over Bolin Creek, and many retaining walls. With the tunnel connection, the trail will extend two miles from Umstead Park to the Chapel Hill Community Center.
