Bring a lunch and talk about *The Dovekeepers* by Alice Hoffman at Books Sandwiched In at 11:30 a.m. Wednesday, June 6, in Meeting Room C at Chapel Hill Public Library. Books Sandwiched In, sponsored by the Friends of the Chapel Hill Public Library, is free and open to the public. A limited number of copies of the books are available at the circulation desk.

This novel, ambitious and mesmerizing, is set in ancient Israel. Nine hundred Jews held out for months against the armies of the Romans on a mountain in the Judean desert, Masada. Only two women and five children survived. The lives of the fiercely independent women intersect in the desperate days of the siege. All are dovekeepers who care for the messenger doves and all have secrets – who they are, where they came from, who fathered them, and who they love. They develop a loyalty so strong that they are willing to sacrifice everything for each other and the children they are entrusted with.
