Tanyard Branch Trail Wayfinding Survey

Have you heard about the new Tanyard Branch Trail coming in June? We want to hear your ideas for the design of signage and pavement markings that direct bicyclists and pedestrians to from the greenway. Take the survey at bit.ly/2sGqACN.

The Tanyard Branch Trail is a greenway project to upgrade the existing natural surface trail to concrete. The new greenway will facilitate bicycle and pedestrian connections from the Northside neighborhood to Umstead Park and Bolin Creek Trail. Once complete, this greenway will serve as complete east-west off-road transportation alternative for people travelling from Downtown to major retail and activity centers near University Mall.
