
Lane Closures

Lanes will be closed at the intersection of Pritchard Avenue and West Rosemary Street during an OWASA Water main replacement along Pritchard Avenue. Two-way traffic will be maintained during the closures, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily through Friday, Aug. 17.

One lane of Eubanks Road will be closed for water line tie-ins for the Carraway Village project from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through Friday, Aug. 17, and Aug. 20–22. Two-way traffic will be maintained.

Transit Service Adjustments

Chapel Hill Transit is adding more service to increase reliability, meet ridership demands and improve connections to employment and retail centers.

Starting Monday, Aug. 13, CW, D, and Saturday routes will have additional service and some schedules and routes will be adjusted.

August Safety Initiatives

Travel with care and pay attention when getting around Chapel Hill. August dates have been scheduled for speed-enforcement and Watch For Me N.C. safety initiatives.

Officers may issue information, warnings or citations for anyone for violating laws. Fines and court costs for these violations begin at \$213. Officers will monitor the following areas to encourage and enforce safe behavior from everyone:

- All day Tuesday, Aug. 14, Weaver Dairy Road & Weaver Dairy Road Extension
- All day Tuesday, Aug. 21, Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard
- 9:30–10:30 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 23, downtown on South Columbia Street and Cameron Avenue
- All day Tuesday, Aug. 28, downtown on Franklin and Rosemary streets
