Chapel Hill is refining its Future Land Use Map focusing on six areas of interest that are located along the Town's major streets. This map will guide the Town as to where shopping, houses, apartments, townhomes, offices, and parks should be located – and how much of each should go in each location.

Friday Center Drive Bus Stops Closed

While Friday Center Drive is being repaved, Chapel Hill Transit will detour the FCX, V and Saturday V routes starting Aug. 20, 2018. Buses will enter and exit the Friday Center park and ride lot through Meadowmont Exchange and will not serve these stops:

- Friday Center Drive at Friday Center (#3027)
- Friday Center at Park and Ride Driveway (#3358)
- Friday Center Drive at Hwy 54 (3587)

The S and HU routes will serve a temporary bus stop on Friday Center Drive beyond the entrance to the conference center's parking lot.

Chapel Hill Transit will make every effort to operate a normal schedule; however the FCX, HU, S and V routes may experience schedule delays during this project.

Updating the Bus Fleet

Chapel Hill Transit has purchased six new low-floor buses over the summer, retiring some of the oldest buses in the fleet. Six more buses have been ordered, and are expected to go into service in early 2019. We anticipate placing an order for additional replacement buses in 2018 using Orange County Transit Plan funds, as we continue our work to improve service reliability and comfort for our customers.

Safety Enforcement Initiatives

Travel with care and pay attention when getting around Chapel Hill. Classes at UNC-Chapel Hill resume on Tuesday, Aug. 21. Students will begin returning to campus the preceding weekend, filling the streets and sidewalks.

August dates have been scheduled for speed-enforcement and Watch For Me N.C. initiatives. These initiatives are an effort to continue to preserve and enhance a safe community in which to travel, whether on two wheels, four wheels, two feet, or other methods.

Officers may issue information, warnings or citations for anyone for violating laws. Fines and court costs for these violations begin at \$213.

Multiple officers will monitor the following areas to encourage and enforce safe behavior from everyone:

- All day Tuesday, Aug. 21, Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard
- 9:30-10:30 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 23, downtown on South Columbia Street and Cameron Avenue
- All day Tuesday, Aug. 28, downtown on Franklin and Rosemary streets
