## Flood Cleanup Assistance

The Town of Chapel Hill is assisting the community with cleanup after Hurricane Florence by waiving fees for the collection of storm debris and flood damaged household items through Oct. 12. Building Services is expediting the processing of permits and inspections for flood damaged properties.

### Cleaning Up

Fees will be waived through Oct. 12 for collection of storm damaged yard waste and flood damaged household items (limited to areas impacted by flood waters).

Call Public Works (919-969-5100) to arrange a special collection of flood damaged household items. Crews will not collect construction and demolition wastes or household hazardous wastes.

### Storm Debris – Yard Waste

The Town of Chapel Hill collects containerized yard waste and small yard waste piles each week. If your trash is collected on Monday, your yard waste is collected on Thursday. If your trash is collected on Tuesday, your yard waste is collected on Friday.

- Put small yard waste (e.g., grass, leaves, pine needles, and twigs) into containers such as a Town yard waste cart or paper bags. No plastic bags! If you are not using a Town yard waste cart, make sure the yard waste container does not exceed 30 gallons or a 50 pound weight limit.

- Place yard waste at the edge of pavement or behind the curb. Ensure that yard waste is not blocking the sidewalk, roadways, bike lanes, fire hydrants, water meters, mailboxes, storm drains, utility boxes or places that will interfere with sight distances at intersections.

- Remove stumps, crossties, and lot clearing debris from curbside yard waste piles as they will not be collected.

- Cut limbs to less than four foot lengths and ten inches in diameter.

- Put yard waste piles and/or containers at the curb by 6 a.m. and remove by 7 p.m. on the collection day.



- Consider purchasing a Town yard waste cart (\$50). Free delivery is available. To order a cart, call 919-969-5100.

Collection of large yard waste piles is not part of the regular scheduled weekly collection service and will be collected as quickly as resources allow once the Town is notified that the pile needs to be collected. Yard waste fees for storm debris piles that exceed three cubic yards will be waived through Oct. 12.

Select an option below for yard waste piles that are larger than a small pickup truckload (i.e., larger than 3 cubic yards):

- Call 919-969-5100 to arrange a collection. The \$125 per truckload fee for the collection of yard waste piles that exceed 3 cubic yards will be waived for storm debris through Oct. 12.

- Rent a 10 cubic yard dumpster for yard waste projects. Cost is \$35 per weekday and \$60 per weekend. Call 919-969-5100 to rent a yard waste dumpster.

- Take large piles of yard waste to one of Orange County's Waste & Recycling Centers. They accept up to one pickup truckload of yard waste per day or weekend period at no charge. For more information, call 919-968-2788.

### Recycling

Only recycle clean and dry recyclable materials. Waterlogged paper or muddy materials should not be placed in recycling containers. Dispose of them in your regular trash cart.

### Permits and Inspections

The Town is expediting the processing of all permits and inspections for flood damaged properties. In most situations, repairing flood damaged properties will require a zoning and/or building permit (for example damaged foundations, interior flood damage, damaged roof, collapsed retaining walls, washed out driveways, sidewalks etc.).
