"Haunted Hill" Halloween Carnival

"Haunted Hill" is coming to the park at Chapel Hill Community Center Park (120 S. Estes Drive) on Saturday, Oct. 20. The event features a trunk-or-treat, games, activities, glow in the dark climb, and a movie in the park. The event starts with Trunk-or-Treat, games and activities from 5 to 7 p.m. The movie, *Coco*, will begin at 6:45 p.m. A glow in the dark climb will run from 7 to 9 p.m. (for ages 6 and older with a signed waiver).

Organizations, businesses, and individuals are needed to participate in the Trunk-or-Treat, which provides a fun and safe form of trick-or-treating. Participants will need to decorate their vehicle's trunk with decorations that are festive but not scary and provide prepackaged candy. We had a record-setting crowd of around 1,000 participants last year!

We will need for cars to arrive between 3:30 p.m. and 4 p.m. The Trunk-or-Treat portion of the evening will end at 6:30 p.m., and cars will be allowed to exit shortly after. This year we will be offering prizes for the best trunk, the most creative trunk, and the people's choice trunk!

New Greenway Art

An art railing has been installed on a pedestrian bridge on the Tanyard Branch Trail that connects Umstead Park with the Northside neighborhood. A dedication ceremony open to the public will be held at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 20, at the bridge site.

Parking is available at Umstead Park, 399 Umstead Drive. Participants can walk about 1,000 feet from Umstead Park, on the paved trail, to reach the bridge. We invite everyone to join us. Created by artist and metal fabricator Leo Gaev, the bridge art features 43 silhouettes cut out of steel securely attached to perforated, steel panels that span both sides of the bridge.

The art, like the bridge, connects the park, trail and the community. The silhouettes are derived from photographs taken by the artist, of people walking the trail, enjoying the park or going about their daily lives throughout the Northside neighborhood. There is a father pushing a stroller, people playing musical instruments, a carrier delivering mail, volleyball players, a boy running with a dog, a woman planting flowers, and other activities.
