

Cedar Fork Subwatershed Study Begins

Residents of neighborhoods in the area of the Cedar Fork Subwatershed may notice field crews in their neighborhoods conducting stream walks over the next few weeks. A team of field technicians is assessing stream conditions and existing stormwater facilities as part of a Town of Chapel Hill study of water quality, flooding and erosion control issues.

To learn more, attend a public information meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 23, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. or from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. in Meeting Room B at Chapel Hill Public Library, 100 Library Drive.

The Cedar Fork study process will include many opportunities to educate, inform and involve the public. Information, updates, maps and public involvement opportunities will be posted online.

Public Meeting on I-40 Widening

The NC Department of Transportation will hold a public meeting on the proposed widening of 11.4 miles of I-40. The meeting will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 24 at the Passmore Center-Great Hall at 103 Meadowlands Drive in Hillsborough.

The interstate would be widened by one lane in each direction, improving traffic flow and helping relieve heavy congestion that develops during commuter times. The project would also improve the N.C. 86 exit.
