## New Turf Fields at Homestead Park

The community is invited to attend a ribbon cutting at 11 a.m. Saturday, March 23, to celebrate new turf fields at Homestead Park, 100 Aquatic Drive.

Thanks to a \$1.4 million joint project among the Town of Chapel Hill, Triangle United Soccer and Rainbow Soccer, Homestead Park has two new artificial turf fields, accessible walkways and fencing.

The event will include a short ceremony and a clinic by members of the men's and women's soccer teams from the University of North Carolina with Triangle United Youth Soccer players.

The artificial turf fields can be played on year round with far less need to close fields due to inclement weather and wet field conditions. The new fields use Purefill Artificial Turf Infill, made of organic cork granules and sand. This product is completely recyclable and sustainable, and provides significant heat reduction. The sub-base design can capture up to a half an inch of rainwater.

## Friday Center Park and Ride Bus Stop Closed

While the bus loop at the Friday Center park and ride lot is being repaired, the Chapel Hill Transit FCX route is being detoured. The FCX route will not serve the bus loop at the park and ride lot.

The route will serve the Friday Center park and ride lot at the alternate bus stop on Friday Center Drive and at a temporary bus stop outside the entrance to the park and ride lot.

The project is expected to last for 90 days.

Chapel Hill Transit will make every effort to operate a normal schedule; however, the FCX route may experience schedule delays during this project.
