Science Expo April 6

Celebrate science at the UNC Science Expo from 11 a.m. until 4 p.m. Saturday, April 6. The Expo features over 100 hands-on activities and science demonstrations lead by STEM students, researchers, and practitioners from UNC-Chapel Hill and the Town of Chapel Hill.

Build your own squishy circuit neuron model, test your mettle in the Department of Psychology's "cold water challenge", take a look at insects under an electron microscope, make your own ice cream, and so much more! Get up close and personal with cutting edge science at UNC Chapel Hill - from the 30 meter wave tank in the Marine Sciences lab to the virtual reality and robotics demonstrations at the Computer Science department. This year's event will also bring out your artistic side as you learn about The Beautiful Brain and the 27-foot-wide Crouching Spider statue. You won't want to miss the (unofficial) attempt to break the Guinness World Record for the Galileo Cannon!

Paula Vogel Hosts Play Writing "Bake-Off"

Area writers have a chance to work with Pulitzer-winning and Tony Award-nominated playwright Paula Vogel as she hosts one of her one-of-a-kind Bake-Offs from 1 to 3 p.m. Saturday, April 6. Participants will have 48 hours to create a short work - a play, song, skit, stand-up, performative poem, etc. - that they will be invited to share with their peers on April 8.


Vogel will announce the theme and assign story elements that the piece must include during the workshop. The inspiration for the theme and elements often come from past works of art to continue conversations that older pieces of art began.

The community workshop is the result of a partnership between Chapel Hill Community Arts & Culture, PlayMakers Repertory Company, and UNC-Chapel Hill's Arts Everywhere initiative.

Fire Hydrant Testing

The Fire Department is performing annual testing of every fire hydrant in Chapel Hill. This helps keep insurance rates as low as possible. Firefighters will flow water through the hydrants for three to four minutes to ensure proper water pressure is reached. The water will be directed into the nearest storm drain. You may notice a slight discoloration in your water after the test; let cold water run for a few minutes until the discoloration is gone.

Choose from more than 20,000 books and other media at the Big Book Sale. The sale begins from 3 to 5:30 p.m. Friday, April 5 (members only-join at the door). The sale will reopen at 7 p.m. for Sip & Shop. If you're already a member, you can bring a guest, or pay \$25 at the door for two shoppers. On Saturday, April 6, the book sale will be open from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Bring your own bag for the bag sale on Sunday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

You'll find lots of all kinds of books for children, young adults and all ages including fiction, mystery, science fiction and romance. And there's lots of non-fiction; biographies, cookbooks, gardening, history, hobbies, travel and more. There are also special book sets and art and coffee table books. Prices start at 50 cents for children's books and mass market paperbacks, with most books priced under \$3.
