Outdoor Pool Opens May 25

The A.D. Clark Pool at the Hargraves Community Center, 216 N. Roberson St., is scheduled to open for the 2019 summer season on Saturday, May 25. The free outdoor swimming pool is open from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day.

The 25-meter pool offers a zero-depth entry pool, locker rooms, showers and a family changing area. There is a wading pool for pre-school aged children and toddlers (swim diapers required).

The pool will be open from 1 to 6 p.m. May 25 and 27. On Sunday, May 26, the pool will be open from 1 to 6 p.m. From May 28 to 31, the pool will be open from 4:30 to 6 p.m. The wading pool is scheduled to open at a later date in order to complete minor repairs.

Road Resurfacing Projects

Resurfacing work will affect traffic on several Chapel Hill roads in the coming months. N.C. Department of Transportation contract crews will work on Franklin Street, Estes Drive, Weaver Dairy Road, and several other secondary roads until Nov. 1. The work can only take place between 9 a.m. and sunset, Monday through Saturday.

Lane closures will be in place throughout the resurfacing project. While driving through work zones, slow down, be cautious and anticipate delays.
