On Saturday, Sept. 7, donations of old electronics will be accepted from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the University Place parking lot on Willow Drive behind Silverspot Cinema.

The Kramden Institute will refurbish reusable equipment and distribute it to families in need. Donations are tax-deductible. This event gives community members a safe and convenient way to dispose of old computers, helps divert these materials from the landfill, and furthers Kramden's mission to help bridge the digital divide.
