Rules for Political Signs

Tuesday, Nov. 5, is Election Day. Political signs are up around the community.

For information on offices up for election, schedules and voting, visit the Orange County Board of Elections at bit.ly/2IDIFTt. Residents in the Durham County portion of Chapel Hill can access more information on Durham County elections at bit.ly/2IC8tyc.

Anyone who knowingly removes, alters, or defaces a campaign sign is guilty of a crime. It is a misdemeanor for a person to steal, deface, vandalize, or unlawfully remove a political sign that is lawfully placed.

Short Term Rentals (STRs) are rentals of housing units for 30 days or less. These are often offered through web hosting platforms such as Airbnb, VRBO, or Homeaway. STRs can be either a room or rooms in a dwelling unit or a whole unit rental that is rented to visitors for a specified period of time.
