Community Meeting: Weaver's Grove

The public is invited to a community meeting about the Weaver's Grove subdivision at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 9, in Meeting Room B at Chapel Hill Public Library.

This meeting will focus on neighborhood interests including stormwater, traffic, noise and roadway access. The Habitat for Humanity of Orange County project is proposed for 32 acres east of Sunrise Road, between Ginger Road and I-40 in northern Chapel Hill. It proposes up to 219 dwelling units including a mix of condos, duplexes, townhouses and single-family homes with a community center, café and amenities. Habitat plans to partner with a market rate home builder to provide moderately priced housing for a variety of demographics at a lower price point that currently does not exist in Chapel Hill.

Fall Shred-A-Thons

Orange County Solid Waste Management will hold two semi-annual free Shred-A-Thons for confidential paper in October. The event is open to residents of Orange County and Chapel Hill local government employees.

On Saturday, Oct. 12, the first Shred-A-Thon will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Eubanks Park & Ride Lot (1/2 mile west of Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard on Eubanks Road in Chapel Hill).

On Saturday, Oct. 19, another Shred-A-Thon will be held from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the recycling site behind Home Depot at Hampton Pointe in Hillsborough.

There is a limit of four boxes or bags. Please bring confidential papers only (no newspaper or magazines). No plastic or metal items (staples are okay).

Recycle non-confidential paper in blue carts or at recycling drop-off sites.

Yes! You Can Compost!

Did you know you can compost your food waste in Orange County? If you want to divert your food waste from the landfill, you can drop it off at the Eubanks Road (1514 Eubanks Road) or Walnut Grove (3605 Walnut Grove Church Road, Hillsborough) Waste and Recycling Centers.

You can compost most food scraps, coffee grounds and filters, tea bags, and paper cups, plates, napkins, and towels. Do not compost glass, metal, plastic, foil, rubber bands, wire, styrofoam or takeout containers.
