## Town Releases Results of Community Survey

According to a recent community survey, residents of the Town of Chapel Hill strongly value their Town services and are

highly satisfied with Chapel Hill's quality of life.

The purpose of the survey is to objectively measure citizen satisfaction with Town services. It provides the Town Council and Town staff with information that can be used in daily management decisions, in prioritizing future budget allocations, and in developing future long-range strategic plans. There was a 35 percent response rate to the survey.

Of the residents who completed the survey:

- 90 percent are satisfied with the quality of life in Chapel Hill
- 82 percent are satisfied with overall quality of services (rated 24 percent above the national average)
- 71 percent are satisfied with the quality of customer service by the Town (rated 15 percent higher than the national average)

## Leaf Collection Has Ended

The last loose leaf collection for this season has been completed by Public Works crews. If you still have leaves to be collected, place them in a yard debris cart or other rigid container for pickup with the weekly yard waste collection (on Thursdays from residents with Monday garbage service and on Fridays for those on a Tuesday garbage collection schedule). Leaves may also be placed in 30 gallon, 50 pound weight limit, brown paper bags that are available at most hardware stores. Leaves in plastic bags will not be collected.

Residents may rent a 12 cubic yard container for yard waste for \$20 a day or \$25 a weekend. Information: 919-969-5100

An alternative to disposal of leaves and yard waste is backyard composting. Residents may obtain information on home composting by calling the N.C. Botanical Gardens (919-962-0522), the Agriculture Extension Agent (919-968-4501), or Orange Community Recycling (919-968-2788).
