Holiday Service Schedule

Most municipal offices will be closed Friday, April 2.

RESIDENTIAL REFUSE COLLECTION: There will be no residential yard waste collection on Friday.

COMMERCIAL REFUSE COLLECTION: There will be no commercial service.

ORANGE REGIONAL LANDFILL will be closed.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING: There will be no change in schedule Friday, April 2, and Monday, April 5. There will be no recycling collection Saturday, April 3, or Sunday, April 4.

ORANGE COUNTY SOLID WASTE CONVENIENCE CENTERS will be closed.

CHAPEL HILL TRANSIT will operate on a reduced Saturday schedule. The following Saturday routes will operate: CM/CW, DM, FG and JN. The Saturday U and NU routes will not operate. On Saturday, April 3, the U and NU routes will not operate and will start at 2 p.m. on Sunday, April 4. Safe Rides will operate as normal on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. The Regional Call Center will be open to provide schedule information from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday, April 2. Call 919-969-4900 (press option 1) or 919-485-RIDE (7433).

HOUSING: Office and Maintenance Division will be closed. For emergency maintenance services, call 919-968-2855.

PUBLIC LIBRARY: The Library will be closed Sunday, April 4.

Fill out your Census Form and mail it in!

In the 2000 Census, Orange County had a return rate of only 70 percent. In 2010, we're hoping that every resident fills out and returns their census forms!

If the 2010 Census questionnaires are not mailed back by April 1, a census taker will follow-up in person.

Don't be alarmed if you see census taker in your neighborhood. Census takers are people from your community who have been hired by the Census Bureau to make sure your neighborhood is represented as accurately as possible.

A census taker's primary responsibility is to collect census information from residences that didn't mail back the 2010 Census questionnaire. They will be visiting households and neighborhoods from April to July 2010.
