The Chapel Hill Town Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday, April 19, in the Council Chamber of Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider an agenda that includes the following:

Public Forum on Deer Population Control

The Chapel Hill Town Council will hold a public forum concerning the issue of controlling the deer population inside the Town of Chapel Hill. See box at right for more information.

Episcopal Church of the Advocate – Special Use Permit

The Town has received a request for approval of a Special Use Permit, for a 42,300 square-foot a phased development including a welcome center and chapel with 278 seats, fellowship space, community assembly building, cottage and parsonage, outreach building, and retreat center, located at 8410 Merin Road (northeast corner of Merin Road and Homestead Road). Parking for 141 vehicles is proposed. The 16.4-acre site is located in the Residential-1 zoning district, outside the Town limits and within the Joint Planning Area and Urban Services Boundary. The site is identified as Orange County Parcel Identifier Number 9870-82-7443.

Bridgepoint Rezoning and Planned Development-Mixed Use Special Use Permit

The Town has received a request for a Zoning Atlas Amendment (rezoning) to rezone a 9.2 acre site located at 2300 Homestead Road from Residential-2 (R-2) and Residential-R-4-Conditional (R-4-C) to Residential-5-Conditional (R-5-C). Accompanying the rezoning application is a Planned Development-Mixed Use Special Use Permit application to demolish two existing single family homes and construct 77,567 square feet for two office/retail buildings and 23 townhomes. Parking for 134 vehicles is also proposed. The proposed development is located on the north side of Homestead Road, just to the west of Weaver Dairy Road Extension. Access to the site is proposed from Homestead Road and Weaver Dairy Road Extension. The site is located in the Residential-2 (R-2) zoning district and partially within the Resource Conservation District. The site is identified as Orange County Parcel Identifier Numbers 9870-91-4489 and 9870-91-9528.

Mosquito Control Program

With warmer weather finally here, the Town of Chapel Hill Mosquito Control Program is under way. Its major goals are to solicit public involvement in reducing the health risk associated with infectious mosquito vectors and to treat historical breeding sites on Town-owned property.

The Town's mosquito control officer continually monitors (every 7-10 days) identified breeding sites on Town-owned property and applies environmentally friendly larvicide where mosquito larvae are present. The Town does not use chemicals to control mosquitoes. Instead, it uses a biological larvicide called "Bactimos" to treat mosquito breeding grounds that contain mosquito larvae. The larvicide does not affect humans, fish, plants or other aquatic wildlife.

The Town treats public parks and recreation facilities and other open space areas. The Mosquito control Officer will not treat private property, but he may be contacted to examine your yard and provide advice, free of charge. During an on-site visit, the officer will evaluate and make recommendations that should reduce, prevent or solve mosquito problems.
